The official cycling tour riders committed to raising \$2,500 each to offset their food and lodging expenses, keeping the focus on the students. They also realize the importance of being an example to show others that cycling is a great way to take care of their health.

hose participating in the DETERMINED Cycling Tour will ride from Garland, Texas, to Longview, Texas. The official kick-off date is April 2,2023, with the final celebration taking place April 7, 2023. Stops along the way include:

**April 7** | Day 6 ride | 82 miles | Texarkana to Longview

## Kenn's Story

any years ago, I received the news from my primary care physician that I was pre-diabetic. Knowing that my grandmother and grandfather died from diabetes complications just a few years prior, I was nearly overcome with fear and worry. My mother had diabetes, and my father had two heart attacks before the age of 55.

We serve a God who is able to heal even hereditary health issues. He has given us the knowledge to improve our well-being through fitness

and nutrition. Knowing I was a

higher health risk, I returned to cycling. Still suffering from service-connected injuries from proudly serving in the United States Marine Corps,
I knew I had to push through the pain to remain healthy.

After sharing my journey of cycling, I was asked to create something for health. That developed into cycling tours around Texas for Adventist education.





## The goal was to stay healthy while witnessing to and supporting the next generation.

Adventist education plays an essential role in teaching students to understand the need for healthy relationships and healthy bodies.

When we start early with our young people in demonstrating the value of healthy life choices, their future becomes healthier.

Every day I am reminded that I am not getting younger. My muscles and bones ache, but I still have my health.

## The Beginning

rom the beginning, the Tour de Youth (2015-2018)
focused on supporting education and health initiatives
that would change the lives of youth and young adults
throughout the southwest territories of the United States. The
Tour de Youth event was not just a multi-day cycling tour to
check off a bucket-list item; it was a life-changing journey to
bring awareness to a silent killer: obesity.

Elizabeth Landau with CNN.com Health reported more than a decade ago that the adult obesity rate had risen in 28 states. She shared in her article, "Ten out of 11 states with the highest rates of obesity are located in the South." These findings

are incredible and frightening.

Angela Glover Blackwell, founder and chief executive officer of

PolicyLink, says

Landau points out that in nearly every state, the incidences of obesity are higher in the Black and Latino communities than for any other ethnicities. Today, the numbers are getting worse. The rate of childhood obesity is not faring any better, according to the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL) with data from the National Survey of Children's Health and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Five of the top-10 cities for youth and young adult obesity are in the state of Texas. The NCSL reports that the overall obesity rate remains high and prevalent among children between the ages of 2 and 19 and has been consistent for 10 years.

The DETERMINED Cycling Tour is seeking to partner with Adventist education, health and wellness and other organizations to do our part to fight this problem. We know

## Kisha's Story

rowing up in a single-parent household, my mother was DETERMINED that I attend the local Seventh-day Adventist school, so she did everything she could to make sure there would be funds for me to continue with my Adventist education. That commitment and dedication was a testament to me that my Adventist education was of high importance, and the sacrifice to make it a reality was a key component to our family life and future.

Many years later, as vice president for education for the Texas Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, it saddens my heart to hear stories about children not being able to attend one of our Seventh-day Adventist schools in the Texas Conference due to finances.

Having worked with Kenn Dixon to raise funds for Adventist education during previous cycling tours, I was excited when he mentioned creating one for the Texas Conference. I was even more excited to hear about the "on your own" options that give everyone a way to promote health and Adventist education while raising funds for an endowment to benefit the Seventh-day Adventist schools here in the Texas Conference.



The spiritual focus is second to none in our Texas Conference schools, preparing students not just for success in this life, but for eternity. It is an indescribable feeling to see students develop their personal relationship with Jesus.

The low student-teacher ratio of our schools helps create individualized learning, above-average scores, with the desire for higher education among students attending Seventh-day Adventist schools.


